It was also recommended that a question about induction be added to the survey.</p> <p>WEST-E: PEAB recommended that students take the WEST-E prior to student teaching.</p>	<p>October -- Mathematics Education (Mark Oursland) March - Social Studies & History (Steve Moore) June - Art Education (Shari Stoddard)</p> <p>NCATE and State Site Visits are scheduled for May 5-9, 2007</p> <p>This is an annual event where PEAB members choose 10 top student teachers based on GPA (3.5+), supervisor nomination, and mentor teacher support.</p> <p>This recommendation was followed and will be implemented in future years as well.</p> <p>Surveys were mailed to 1st & 3rd year teachers and principals in March with a follow-up mailing in April. The response rate did increase from 11% to 18%. Whether to continue with paper mailings or to try the on-line survey again will be discussed in the Fall. The question re. induction will be added to future surveys.</p> <p>The PEAB recommendation has been implemented beginning Sept. 1, 2006. All students will be required to take (not necessarily pass) the WEST-E prior to beginning student teaching.</p>
